EVENT SUMMARY

The LTТА in Bonn brought together all partner organisations for three days of learning, collaboration, and exchange. Hosted at the Universitätsclub Bonn and DigitalHub Bonn, the event combined interactive workshops, discussions, and social activities in a supportive and engaging atmosphere.

WHAT WE LEARNED

Throughout the sessions, participants explored five key modules addressing various aspects of informal caregiving — from understanding the role of carers and their rights to improving wellbeing, communication, and practical caregiving skills.



WHAT WE ACHIEVED

CARDET, EXEO LAB, Right Challenge, EHFF, IUS, and EDRA each led sessions that encouraged reflection, active participation, and sharing of experiences. The modules were praised for their practical relevance, clear structure, and emphasis on real-life

The LTTA concluded with an evaluation confirming its high success, both in terms of organisation and educational value. Participants particularly appreciated the open discussions, collaborative spirit, and opportunities for personal connection — strengthened further by informal networking events such as the joint dinner and the final excursion to the Siebengebirge.



RESULTS & KEY FINDINGS

During the LTTA, several important adjustments and insights were achieved to improve the overall logical flow of the training materials.

Module 4 (Wellbeing and Coping with Informal Care) and Module 5 (Communication and Relationship Building) were swapped. Furthermore, Module 2 will be expanded to place greater emphasis on the experiences and needs of young carers, ensuring a more inclusive approach.

In addition, Module 1 will now incorporate national legal frameworks related to informal caregiving.

Overall, the LTTA was evaluated as highly successful, well-structured, and practical, offering valuable learning experiences and concrete outcomes that will strengthen the further development and implementation of the project.
